

Evaluating the World Infrared Standard Group A field campaign to assess potential changes to the WISG

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What: the goal is to determine whether the next improvement in infrared radiometry uncertainty can be made with confidence based on comparisons of two independently developed absolute instruments: IRIS and ACP

Where: ARM Southern Great Plains Site

When: Fall 2017 (~ 4 weeks available starting early October)

World Infrared Standard Group Maintained in Davos, Switzerland World Radiation Center Four pyrgeometers calibrated by **Absolute Sky-scanning Radiometer (ASR)** All ARM Eppley PIRs calibrated by WISG

Infrared Integrating Sphere (IRIS) Gröbner et al. 2012

Absolute Cavity Pyrgeometer (ACP) Reda et al. 2012

IRIS-ACP agreed within ~ 1 Wm⁻² WISG 2-5 Wm⁻² lower depending on the water vapor column

- + ACP, IRIS, and 2 instruments calibrated to WISG (ASR not available)
- + 4 weeks in fall at SGP
- + Range in water vapor desired (PWV < 1 cm < PWV)
